# STEP AFRIKA! RESIDENCY TO BE HELD AT MARCUS PERFORMING ARTS CENTER IN PARTNERSHIP WITH MPAC CULTURAL AMBASSADOR DONALD DRIVER

Multi-day engagement with Step Afrika! and MPAC Cultural Ambassador Donald Driver will take place January 18-20

**MILWAUKEE** (Thursday, January 12, 2023) – <u>Marcus Performing Arts Center</u> (MPAC) is presenting a 3-day residency with <u>Step Afrika!</u>, an award-winning African American dance company dedicated to the art of stepping, in partnership with MPAC Cultural Ambassador <u>Donald Driver</u> from January 18-20.

The multi-day engagement will feature artists from Step Afrika! leading community workshops, a Roll Call showcase with the Divine 9 Greek organizations within the <u>National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC)</u> of Milwaukee, a student matinee performance for over 2,000 youth, and a public performance.

Founded in 1994, Step Afrika! is the first professional Dance Company in the world dedicated to the tradition of stepping. The Company blends percussive dance styles practiced by historically African American fraternities and sororities with traditional West and Southern African dances and an array of contemporary dance and art forms into a cohesive, compelling artistic experience.

Under Mr. Williams' leadership, stepping has evolved into one of America's cultural exports, touring more than 50 countries across the globe. Step Afrika! now ranks as one of the top ten African American dance companies in the United States.

Step Afrika! blends percussive dance styles practiced by historically African American fraternities and sororities, traditional West and Southern African dances, and an array of contemporary dance and art forms into a cohesive, compelling artistic experience. Performances are much more than dance shows; they integrate songs, storytelling, humor, and audience participation. The blend of technique, agility, and pure energy makes each performance unique and leaves the audience with their hearts pounding.

Step Afrika! promotes stepping as an educational tool for young people, focusing on teamwork, academic achievement, and cross-cultural understanding. The Company reaches tens of thousands of Americans each year through a 50-city tour of colleges and theatres and performs globally as Washington DC's Cultural Ambassador. Step Afrika! has earned Mayor's Arts Awards for Outstanding Contribution to Arts Education (2005), Innovation in the Arts (2008), and Excellence in an Artistic Discipline (2012), and has performed at the White House for President Barack Obama and the First Lady.

Step Afrika! is featured prominently at the Smithsonian's new National Museum of African-American History & Culture with the world's first stepping interactive exhibit. In 2017, Step Afrika! made its Off-Broadway debut with the critically-acclaimed production *The Migration: Reflections on Jacob Lawrence*. In 2020, Step Afrika! Premiered its new feature-length work, *Drumfolk*, in ten major markets including a return to Broadway at the New Victory Theatre.
