MARCUS PERFORMING ARTS CENTER PRESENTS NRITYAGRAM RESIDENCY TO SHARE THE ART OF CLASSICAL INDIAN DANCE

Multi-day engagement with Nrityagram Dance Ensemble to take place April 24-28

MILWAUKEE (April 19, 2023) – <u>Marcus Performing Arts Center</u> (MPAC) is presenting a weeklong residency with <u>Nrityagram</u>, a renowned Indian dance company who is dedicated to bringing Odissi – one of the oldest dance styles in the world – to audiences worldwide. Led by Artistic Director <u>Surupa Sen</u>, their traditional practice is infused with a bright, contemporary spirit, which has captured the imagination of people around the globe.

The multi-day engagement focusing on the art of classical Indian dance will feature artists from Nrityagram leading community workshops, a lecture/demonstration, a student matinee performance for over 1,500 area youth, and a public performance with a post-show talkback.

One of the premier Indian dance ensembles performing today, the Nrityagram Dance Ensemble (pronounced NRI-thyuh-graam) has been teaching and performing for over 25 years. More than a dance company, Nrityagram was founded as a *Gurukula* (school) devoted to Indian dance. The all-female ensemble's daily life of intensive training and meditation brings to the stage compelling, captivating performances that are expressive and lyrical.

Nrityagram Residency schedule is as follows:

Monday, April 24

4:30-5:30pm – Odissi Intermediate Dance Class with youth dancers. Pre-registration required. Participants will learn about the historical origin of Odissi and the language: body positions, basic movement technique, and the use of hand gestures and facial expressions for expressional dance.

Tuesday, April 25

9:30-10:30am – Lecture/Demonstration at Swanson Elementary.

The presentation will feature the history and evolution of Odissi and Kandyan dance as well as short dance sequences of both forms. The event will culminate in a Q&A session with the students.

4:30-5:30pm – Odissi Beginner Dance Class with youth dancers. Pre-registration required. This introductory class is an opportunity to learn basic movement phrases and the body-training specific to Odissi, as evolved and practiced at Nrityagram.

Thursday, April 27

10:00-11:00am – Nrityagram Student Matinee Performance for over 1,500 Milwaukee area youth. Geared for young audiences, company members illustrate the breathtaking beauty of both Odissi and Kandyan dance forms, demonstrating how each reflects the culture of their homeland and the differences that set each apart. Accompanied by Nrityagram's live music ensemble and a Kandyan drummer, this show includes audience participation and a Q&A session.

Friday, April 28

7:30pm – Nrityagram Public Performance of "Āhuti" with Chitrasena Dance Company. A post-show Q&A with the artists will follow the performance.

About Nrityagram

Regarded as one of the foremost dance companies of India, the Nrityagram Dance Ensemble is committed to carrying Indian dance into the twenty-first century. Led by Artistic Director Surupa Sen, the company is devoted to Odissi – one of the oldest dance styles in the world. Their traditional practice is infused with a bright, contemporary spirit, which has captured the imagination of people worldwide.

The rare opportunity to see them perform live is an exploration of culture, technique, storytelling, and devotion that is not to be missed.

Nrityagram (pronounced NRI-thyuh-graam), meaning "dance village," is located outside Bangalore, India. More than a dance company, Nrityagram is home to a school inspired by the *Gurukula*, an ancient teaching paradigm, and the dance ensemble – a village of artists dedicated to the practice and nurture of a 2000-year-old art form.

Founded by Odissi dancer Protima Gauri, the all-female ensemble's daily life of intensive training and meditation brings to the stage compelling, captivating performances that are expressive and lyrical. The ensemble not only explores creative expansions of tradition but are also able to commission fresh compositions from leading Indian classical musicians.

About Odissi

Odissi is one of the pre-eminent classical dance forms of India, originating in the Hindu temples of the state of Odisha in eastern India. Its theoretical base traces back to the *Natyashastra*, the ancient Sanskrit Hindu text on classical Indian performing arts. Fortifying this base is archeological evidence excavated from ancient sites which depict scenes of music and dance, the oldest of which are the Jain cave-temples of Udayagiri and Khandagiri, dating back to the second century BC.

Odissi is celebrated around the world for its lyricism, sensuality, and emphasis on *bhakti bhava* (attitude of devotion and surrender). Originally a sacred ritual dedicated to the gods, Odissi speaks of love and union, between human and divine, transporting viewers to enchanted worlds of magic and spirituality.

About Chitrasena Dance Company

With a vision to inspire and exhilarate through the traditional dances and drums of Sri Lanka, the Chitrasena Dance Company is at the forefront of transforming the Sri Lankan arts landscape.

Founded in 1943 by Guru Chitrasena along with his wife, Vajira, they worked tirelessly for decades to carefully distill ancient rhythmic rituals. By reviving and refining elements of traditional dances while experimenting with new forms, the Company is renowned for its authentic dance language with a fresh, new perspective.

For over seven decades the Chitrasena Dance Company has given life to compelling performances ranging from a rich repertoire of dance and drumming pieces, to acclaimed original ballets and productions inspired by ancient rituals and contemporary culture.
